Measure Up - Wrap Up

This year's Measure up Campaign, held on the last weekend in April and the first weekend in May, was a success. The final tally -following the change was counted by Saneese Services - amounted to XXXX. All who participated can pat yourselves on the back. This year Kroger at Hill and Refugee limited us to Friday night only, but that 4 hour period netted XXX. That was the April effort.

Friday night on the first weekend in May we had our best coverage. Three intersections were manned with 8 volunteers. Saturday's effort was concentrated at Hill and West Columbus Streets. As a final push, we had coverage at each Mass on the same weekend - after a very positive pulpit announcement by Father Jim. Our parishioners were indeed generous. The norm was a multiple dollars from those who contributed.

80 % of the proceeds stay in Fairfield County and will be given in August to Pickerington Special Olympics (youth) and the Fairfield Industries (Part of the County Mental Retardation Department - MRD - adult work program). The balance will be contributed at K of C night at Clipper Stadium to Franklin County MRD. 100% of the proceeds goes to charity.

council the start up fee us this fundraiser to create funds for the committee. This will be discussing in greater detail next month.

Community Kitchen: The Grand Knight would like to set up a committee formed to see what we can do as a council activity to assist this and other organizations on a quarterly basis or otherwise. This is starting as an informal basis until we can define it better.
