Award: From this information the Scholarship committee will contact the Winner(s) and make arrangements for the award of the scholarship(s) at a council meeting. Award(s) by the scholarship committee will be final.

Business Meeting Minutes

December 12, 2007

Meeting opened at: 7:32 by Grand Knight Jesse Garcia

Roll of Officers: Chaplain, Treasurer, Inner Guard, Outer Guard, Lecturer 3 year and 1 year trustee - excused

Reading of the Minutes: A motion was made to approve the Minutes from the previous meeting as recorded this motion was seconded and passed. A correction was made to the Deputy Grand Knights phone in the newsletter.

Chaplain's Report: No Report

Admissions: We currently have one candidate Scott Robison who is leaving for Scotland starting Jan. 5th we are trying to get him into a 1st degree before he leaves.

Grand Knights: The Grand Knight offered his thanks to the entire officer who showed up at the officers meeting on Saturday Dec 1st. He thought it was nice to see a seating shortage.

The Grand Knight informed the Council that we approved a \$200 donation for the Parish outreach program; this should help to provide a couple hams for the families in Portsmouth. The Council also approved a \$250 Kroger gift card for a Knight in Need under the relief program.

The Grand Knight reminded everyone that the "of the Year" award nominations are coming up and we would really like you to participate in this. It was stated in the newsletter multiple times. If you know of a Knight, Lady, Clergy, or Volunteer ... do a little write up and submit it to an officer.

The Grand Knight informed the council that we have 475 points towards our 1500 point goal and in Division V we are tied for 3rd. Frank Hare and Ron Schubert are keeping our reports on track.

The Grand Knight announced that Scholarship information is now available on website. This includes applications. The e-mail button does not work due to a Microsoft security issue so save the form fill it out and send it as an e-mail. The security will be removed from it so that this can be done.

The Grand Knight notified everyone that next month will be the 6 month mark and we are now into the busy season, pancake breakfasts, then fish fry's and the Annual St. Patrick's day party. The Council is also looking to move the Wives' Appreciation Dinner into the February timeframe, this we thought would generate a better turnout. The thought is that most of the brother Knights think that they have not been active enough to invite their wife to the dinner, well since it may possibly be right in the middle of busy season ... guess what ... invite your wife!

The Grand Knight has notified us that the Red Hatter's are looking into possible doing the desserts for one of the Fish Fry's. (February 15th). They will dress up and put up signs to help in their recruiting.

The Grand Knight reminded everyone that the Blue Coats dinner is just over the horizon so please keep in mind we will need help for this special dinner.

The Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight are looking to talk to Fr. Jim after the first of the year to see what course corrections are needed in our service to the Parish.

The Grand Knight announced that Dave McAllister will once again be doing the Free Throw contest, so if you can lend a hand please see him.

The Grand Knight also mentioned that there is an obligation for the officers to attend the Officers meeting on the first Saturday of the month.

Communications: the Grand Knight notified the council that we have been getting a lot of out-of-state requests for donations but have none we are currently taking action on. We also received a thank you card from Larry Rosser for the Mass card we had sent them. We received the paper work for the Clergy appreciation dinner we are including Fr. Klima, Deacon Hector, Mary Lloyd, and Fr Fairchild so far.

Treasurers Report: No Report

Bills: were read and submitted for payment

Service Committees:

Membership: No Report

Program Director: We are at the end of the reporting period.

Church Director: Pew Crew will clean the Church after the 8:30 Mass Dec. 20th there will be Men's choir for Christmas Morning anyone interested please attend practice on Wed. evenings.

Youth/Squires: Squires have been busy this month helping at the Pancake breakfast. They have a retreat this month and they will help to decorate the Church on the 23rd. They will be helping to load the Portsmouth truck. The Squires were thanked for their help with the book sale during the last pancake breakfast.

Respect Life Committee: The March for Life will not have a bus this year. We are looking into other alternatives. One is a group from Cincinnati. This group leaves Monday and does not come back till Wednesday. It is \$180 per person 2/room. This does not include the Congressional breakfast and will not be in time for the Basilica Mass. St Cecelia's has a bus leaving Saturday and coming back Tue. This would let attendee make the Mass and costs \$190/person based on 4/room. The SPY kids would not be able to make that trip due to a leadership conflict on Saturday. Those interested are being surveyed to decide the best alternative. If not enough kids are interested in the new alternatives money will be refunded to the Council.

Kroger Cares Program: No Report awaiting the check from Kroger's.

Pancake Breakfast report: We had 203 breakfasts served after the 9:30 mass. This is a record number served over the last three years, next closest was 189 in December of 2005. The quality of the breakfasts is up. We received many compliments on the eggs, hash browns, Bob Evan’s sausage and the hotter breakfasts. French toast sales are declining as the egg breakfasts are increasing. Profits significantly up over November as we have carryover of supplies purchased prior to the November breakfast. Plus, we increased prices this year. Tons of help from Knights and Squires!

Santa Visit: Looks like it cost \$XXX due to the cost of the film we are looking into alternative methods of taking and printing pictures, Jerry will be looking into that. Scholarship: It was announced that there was an article in the newsletter for the Scholarship. It is available to anyone with Children in Grade or High School attending a Catholic school. The application is on the web site. It has a form and an essay. Usually we have only 2 or 3 a year. It was questioned weather we should open it up to the Parish with preference to relatives of Knights.

Retention: We have cleaned up our roster by removing 29 members. We are now seeking to insure that all information stays up to date. These removals will lower our chances to reach Star Council this year.

Awards: The Grand Knight asked each member to think of some one to submit for the following awards:

Knight of the Year, Lady of the Year, Youth of the Year, Family of the Year and Clergy f the Year

These awards are something that we put off until the last minute and the officers just pick people to turn in. So we are soliciting your help, nominate someone you feel has made an impact on the Council. With the nominations the Council receives, the officers will then review and chose. The Council will have a special ceremony at an upcoming event

New Business:

Adobe emailing problems: I think I have discovered the problem that is effecting the email submittals on the various forms. How Many Heisman Winners Has Abortion Killed?

In its December 14, 2007, *Spirit & Life* newsletter **Human Life International** President Rev. Thomas J. Euteneuer asked and answered the title question:

The sports world recently greeted the news that this year's Heisman Trophy Winner, Tim Tebow from the University of Florida, was almost a casualty of abortion. Twenty-some years ago he was not the strapping 6'3", 235 lb. beloved sports hero that he is today. At that time he was a one-inch-long unborn child whose existence, because of an amoebic infection, was defined as threat to his mother's health. Pam Tebow, his mother, was told by a doctor that it would be in her best interests to abort this baby, and she refused. Her husband backed her up on that generous decision, and seven months later they gave birth to a perfectly healthy boy. Little did they know that twenty years later they would be standing on a national stage with a Heisman Trophy winner giving that magnificent witness to life. The world thanks you, Mr. and Mrs. Tebow! There cannot be a more touching Advent story than this.

I wonder if anyone has ever asked how many potential Heisman Trophy winners abortion has actually killed. The answer is, *twelve*. Reflect on that a bit as you read further because there is a larger lesson in the Tebows' witness.

Dr. Brian Clowes, HLI researcher, has examined the data from the 2007 *Statistical Abstract of the United States* (most recent census data) and extrapolated the numbers of the various professions and categories of Americans who have been eliminated in the wake of nearly 49 million legalized abortions, one third of all Americans conceived since 1973. The following numbers are based on the actual government estimates of the professions represented in America. So then, who have we lost to abortion?

- 2 US Presidents
- 7 Supreme Court Justices
- 102 US Senators and 589 Congressmen
- 8,123 Federal, district and local court judges
- 31 Nobel Prize laureates
- 328 Olympic medalists including 123 Gold medalists
- 6,092 professional athletes
- 134,841 physicians and surgeons
- 392,500 registered nurses
- 70,669 priests, ministers, rabbis and imams including 6,852 priests and 11,010 nuns (vocations "shortage"?)
- 1,102,443 teachers (K-12)
- 553,821 truck drivers
- 224,518 maids and housekeepers
- 336,939 janitors
- 134,028 farmers and ranchers
- 109,984 police officers and sheriff's deputies
- 39,477 firefighters
- 17,221 barbers, and
- 24,450,000...women (the gender of roughly half of all children aborted).

These numbers of course are only the tip of the iceberg. Keep in mind that we get our statistics about abortion from the abortion industry itself which has a vested interest in under-reporting the numbers. Likewise, these categories are only a few of the professions that Americans actually work in and are by no means a

full portrayal of the total American workforce. What they represent, however, is the immense *human toll* that abortion takes on a society. Abortion-promoters present abortion as an exclusively private choice, but thirty-five years of abortion exposes the perniciousness of that lie. There is a social toll that comes from abortion which cannot easily be corrected.

For three and a half decades the feminists have reveled in a misleading "freedom to choose," and on the basis of that false "right" have eliminated their children and done immense damage to the family as the basic unit of society. Those who respect these sacred realities, on the other hand, have their wives and husbands to grow old with, their children to enjoy and their grandkids to play with and spoil. The love of life, marriage and family never leaves its adherents penniless, lonely or abandoned, and every now and then God throws in a Heisman Trophy just to show the rest of us that it's all worth it.

Fish Fry News



Commentary: You can't take Christ out of Christmas

(CNN) -- This whole push to remove Christ from the Christmas season has gotten so ridiculous that it's pathetic. Because of all the politically correct idiots, we are being encouraged to stop saying "Merry Christmas" for the more palatable "Happy Holidays." What the heck are "Seasons Greetings"? Can someone tell me what season we are greeting folks about? A Christmas tree? Oh, no! It's now a holiday tree. Sure, I know I sound like a reincarnation of a flower child, but really, do we have to be so crass during the Christmas season?

It's time that we return to traditional values, and end this ridiculous charade.
