

Respect Life: The Slave Next Door

Last weekend (Apr 2) Vicki and I went to the Diocesan Respect Life Conference at St. Andrew's parish. Several speakers did an excellent job, but one in particular really stood out with her heart wrenching story. Theresa Flores is a survivor of domestic sex trafficking as a teenager and is an author, advocate, and director of awareness and training for Gracehaven, an organization focused on human trafficking.

Theresa was an average teen from an upper middle class Irish Catholic family when her family moved to an upscale suburb of Detroit because of her father's job promotion. At age 15 coming from a small rural high school, she was overwhelmed by her new high school with thousands of students and made few friends. The new high school had a diverse population, though mostly upper middle class. One prevalent group was the Chaldeans, Catholic Arabs who left Iraq because they could not practice their Christian faith there. She tried to make friends with some of the Chaldean girls but they were not allowed to associate with whites. She did befriend a couple of Chaldean boys, though.

She found one particular Chaldean attractive and nice. Daniel was 17 and seemed to like Theresa, so when he offered to give her a ride home one day, she accepted. She got a little nervous when he went to his home instead of hers, but he said he just needed to pick up something. He invited her into his large and beautiful home and once inside showed her around. Up in his room, he offered her a soda, which she accepted without realizing he had put something in it. They sat on his bed and kissed, but when he tried to go further, she refused. She was a good Catholic girl, still a virgin, and wanted to save herself for marriage.

She began to feel lightheaded and dizzy and was unable to fend him off as he proceeded to rape her in spite of her protests and attempts to push him away. Afterward he apologized, saying he didn't realize she really was a virgin. He took her home and she never mentioned what happened to her parents because she had been told by them to never go in a car with a boy without their permission.

A few days later Daniel told her it was very important that she meet him by his car after school. He told her that his cousins had come into his house while they were there and took pictures of them in bed together. He showed her some of the pictures and told her she would have to have sex with his cousins to get them back. She knew the cousins from school as cruel and dangerous bullies. A few nights later Daniel called her at midnight on the private line in her room and told her to meet him on the street behind her home immediately. She snuck out of the house and went with Daniel back to his house, where they quietly went into the basement. She was impressed with the wealth of the home. The basement had several beautifully furnished rooms, including bedrooms. The cruel cousins took her into one of the bedrooms and told her she would have to earn the pictures back by working for them. They said her fair skin, blond hair, and blue eyes would be an asset to their business, but didn't give her a choice. They forced her onto the bed and they both had their way with her. When they were done, Daniel took her home.

For the next two years, she was forced to do whatever they wanted. She would get midnight phone calls two or three times a week, meet Daniel behind her house and he would take her to the cousins, who would force her to serve 10 to 15 men a night. She never knew where they were taking her, often to quite wealthy

homes, but sometimes to motels and other locations. Sometimes Daniel would require her to come with him directly after school to service their customers. If she attempted to get away or resisted in any way, she was severely punished. They threatened to harm her younger brothers and often followed her and her brothers as they walked home from school. She became quite good at lying and making excuses to explain to her parents why she was late from school.

Near the end of the two years, instead of Daniel picking her up after a midnight phone call the cruel cousins picked her up. They took her to a sleazy motel in one of the worst areas of Detroit. There were two dozen Arab men in the hotel room and they took turns with her until she passed out. She has no idea how many took her after that. When she awoke she was naked, alone, and nauseated from the liquor and drugs they forced her to take. As she got to her feet, severe pain shot through her legs, privates, and abdomen. She dropped to the floor and crawled to the bathroom to throw up. Eventually she found her clothes and went to the small restaurant at the motel to get help. After awhile, a policeman came by and she got a ride home from him. She still didn't tell her parents what was happening, but she was grounded for a long time. The next day the cruel cousins killed her dog as a warning to her, but left her alone, apparently out of fear of the police.

Around this time Theresa's father was transferred away from Detroit to the East Coast. Theresa didn't tell Daniel or his cousins she was leaving and didn't tell any of her friends exactly where she was moving. When she left Detroit, she finally was free of her slavery. It took her many years to get over the trauma and many more before she could tell her story. Now in her forties, she is a single mother of three with a master's degree in counseling education, a licensed social worker, and an advocate for victims of human trafficking. She is the author of the book "The Slave Across the Street" which tells the story of her time as a sex slave.

Theresa told us Ohio is the fifth worst state for human trafficking. As her story illustrates, it is not limited to the poor or immigrants, but can happen to anyone. Being aware of it can help. Theresa had loving and caring parents, but still got in way over her head. She was lucky to escape - most in her situation never get out, except by death from her pimp or suicide. Fathers, grandfathers, uncles, and other family members can help by being aware of what their children are doing, being involved in their lives, and by always being open so their children feel comfortable coming to them with anything.
