

Business Meeting Notes – September 12, 2012

The meeting was preceded by the Installation of Officers for the fiscal 2012/13 year. The ceremony was conducted by our Past District Deputy, Mark Borys as our current D.D. is still experiencing health issues.

The official meeting began at 7:45PM. As a note ... only 17 members were in attendance. We pray that more of our brothers choose to attend future meetings.

Roll Call of Officers: All were present except our Advocate, 3 year Trustee, Lecturer and Chaplain.

The minutes of the last meeting were motioned for approval by Frank Hare, seconded by Wayne Patterson, voted on and approved.

Chaplain's Report: Deacon Hector Raymond spoke for Father Klima on the "key(s) to being a faithful servant". Deacon Hector shared his struggles for creating a homily that week when the topic was turning the other cheek. He mentioned how difficult that was ... considering it being the week of the anniversary of 9/11. Prayer seems to be the only answer. And with our ambassador being murdered as well ... he asked "how can we survive?" It was mentioned that we are at an extremely important time in our country. Be prepared to pray and search. Be ready to answer our Lord's own question of "who do you say I am?"

Grand Knight's Report: G.K. George Schneider then began with a list of important items.

Our Grand Knight first asked us all to stand up for our Catholic values.

He next gave thanks to all for our tremendous showing and assistance with the Church Festival. Father Klima gave us great recognition in the bulletin as well.

Brother George then announced the resignation of Brother Jim Thesing as our Church Director. Please prayerfully consider taking over this responsibility when our Grand Knight makes the request of you.

G.K. Schneider then announced an opportunity for all to attend a "Breakfast with the Bishop" on Friday, October 5th at 7:45am at the Hyatt Regency downtown. The guest speaker is Senior Associate Justice, Paul Pfeifer whose topic will be "Religion's Role in Today's Society".

If any have an interest in the statewide "Knights Bowling Invitational" (to be held in Dayton) please see George or call Dave Miller at (419) 524-1183. A five man team is needed and the cost is \$50 per man. The tournament is not until March, but registration is needed well before that. Last year we reportedly had interest from some, but the registration was not completed in time to be involved.

Finally, our Grand Knight mentioned that our Football Frenzy ticket turn in is set for October 27. Buy or sell yours soon, as they are going like hot cakes! Honest! Treasurer Report: Brother Mike Phillips stated our account balances and plans for turning over our CD's as they mature. He then shared the revised budget breakdown for the fiscal year and

the proposed amount available for spending in our various programs. Please see Mike if you wish a copy. We remain financially sound.

Financial Secretary Report: Brother Mark Borys then reported on all bills and income for the month. These bills were motioned to be sent to the trustees for signing and payment. This was accomplished in a timely manner.

Report of the Trustees: Trustees Bowie, Patterson and Garcia had no report.

Chancellor's Report: Brother Mike Sillings had no report.

Report on Programs and Committees:

Membership Committee Report: Mike Sillings reported on Membership and admissions. We added Matt Mitts (sorry for the spelling Matt – editor's note). Our membership quota is now down to 16. Our insurance quota is still at 6 for the year. Remember our state goal for membership to achieve Star Council is at least one member per month. Please help us attain that goal and recruit new members today!

Program Director: Brother Frank Hare reported that our programs are laid out for the year and he hopes to finalize by October 6th. He also extended heartfelt thanks for all of the assistance with food at the Festival! We did well! The new offerings were well received by festival goers and funds received improved greatly!

Church Director: No report.

Community Director: Brother Bog Glavan initiated a discussion on the Knights supporting our local food pantry. He was surprised to hear that many of our Knights are already involved in this endeavor. Brother Mike Croyle will gladly entertain any other opportunities for community assistance and involvement from our Knights.

Council Director: No report.

Family Director: Brother Mike Phillips reported that our Fall Family Festival is set for October 20th. Please put it on your calendar to attend and assist ... especially with the set up and tear down. Dick and Joie Petersen head this event and do an awesome job! But, please ... consider helping them set up in prep and/or tearing down at the end after a long day. We usually just need help with the kitchen and the decorations.

Youth Director: Brother Jesse Garcia noted that Religious Education is scheduled to begin. He challenged his brother Knights to volunteer to teach! Get involved!

Right to Life Director: Brother Jim Anderson spoke for Edd Chinnock and reminded all of our opportunity to "represent" at the Abortion Clinic at 5888 Cleveland Avenue on October 9th. This is part of a "40 Days for Life" campaign to oppose abortion. Take an hour to stand vigil. (Editors note - again ... and if you have not read it, Brother Anderson had an article published in the April 29 issue of the Catholic Times (page 9), entitled "Eighty Minutes for Life" describing the impact this experience had on him. It is a great read ... and as a continued note ... Jim has been approved by the Bishop to take his next step in pursuing the priesthood! Pray for him as he continues his journey).

Squires Report: Brother Mark Knight had no report, but knowledge has it that our squires intend to run a Pancake Breakfast as their main money-maker in the immediate future. This will precede our Knight's Pancake Breakfasts. The Squires would appreciate assistance with our Knight's who "know the ropes". With all of the help these young men have provided us ... I am sure we will respond.

Unfinished Business: No unfinished business.

New Business:

Brother Mark Borys announced his intention to donate his compensation for the Financial Secretary position to a seminarian. This year that amount will be \$501. What a great gesture!

Report of the Fourth Degree: Brother Bog Glavan reported that the 4th Degree is conducting a 50/50 Raffle with only 200 tickets at \$10 each being sold. The winner will receive \$1000 with the remainder going to the Assembly. These are much better odds than the lottery!

Respect Life: Respect Life: Vote Pro-Life!

The election is less than a month away. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) says that abortion is “intrinsically evil” and that any candidate who supports abortion should be considered ineligible for office. This does NOT make you a “one issue” voter - it just recognizes that these five non-negotiable issues MUST be considered:

All five moral issues—abortion, euthanasia, embryonic stem-cell research, human cloning, and same-sex “marriage” - have been definitively declared by the Church to be objectively and absolutely immoral. As faithful Catholics, we are required to stand against all five and - with only rare exceptions - to vote against politicians who support any of them.

So get out and VOTE PRO-LIFE and PRO-CATHOLIC!

I just received an email from Ohio Right to Life stating that Ohio abortions have dropped to a historic low. Unfortunately, Franklin County abortions increased. Fairfield County abortions decreased slightly. The following announcement from ORTL tells the story:

Reported abortions have never been fewer in the state of Ohio, according to the latest report released by the Ohio Department of Health. The 2011 Abortion Report reveals not only a new all time low in the number of abortions, but also one of the largest decreases in state recorded history, dropping by 12% (3,359 abortions) since 2010. Tragically 24,764 abortions were still performed in Ohio during 2011.

“Our mission at Ohio Right to Life is to protect women and children. Our goal is to change hearts and minds to impact our culture positively for life. This report represents not only the success of Ohio Right to Life’s advocacy, but successes of a combined strategy to change attitudes regarding abortion,” said President Mike Gonidakis. “After all, these really aren’t just numbers; each tally represents a woman and the life she carried inside of her. This report recounts to us that more Ohio women than ever before are choosing to hold a newborn baby in their arms.”

The 2011 Ohio Abortion Report demonstrates that of all abortions:

The majority occur in the metropolitan areas of Cuyahoga County at 36%, Franklin at 23%, and Hamilton at 18%; 49% were performed upon young women and girls under the age of 24; 85% occur during the first 12 weeks of pregnancy; 46% were performed upon Ohio residents who have previously had an abortion. 39% were performed upon African American women while they make up less than 10% of the population.

“Because of the leadership provided by Governor John Kasich and Ohio’s pro-life majorities in the General Assembly, Ohio Right to Life and its affiliated chapters were able to pass an unprecedented amount of pro-life legislation in 2011,” said Gonidakis. “As such, we’ve coined 2011 ‘the best year yet’. Today’s 2011 report gives that statement real meaning. The entire pro-life movement’s advocacy extends beyond the halls of government and into our Churches, schools and communities. We firmly believe Ohioans’ attitudes towards abortion are changing with the deepest respect for life.”

Finally, we are already planning our trip to Washington, DC, for the March for Life 2013. We will leave Seton early Thursday, January 24, for the trip to the Shrine of the Immaculate

Conception for the March for Life Vigil Mass. This is the Mass I have described before that has so many Cardinals, Bishops, priests, deacons, and seminarians that it takes over 30 minutes just for the entrance procession! After this most impressive Mass, we will go to our hotel in downtown DC. After our free breakfast, those who wish can go to the Youth Rally and Mass with our SPY students. The rest may attend any of the many Pro-Life events going on in DC that morning. Around noon we will meet for the March itself and return home immediately following the March. PLEASE SPREAD THE WORD ABOUT THIS WONDERFUL TRIP - we should fill the bus from Seton alone and our Knights should be leading the way! Please contact me for more information.

And remember: ALWAYS PRAY FOR LIFE!

"On the Journey to Ordination"

This past June Bishop Campbell gave me formal support to be considered for ordination to the Catholic priesthood under the terms of the Pastoral Provision. I submitted my required dossier consisting of letters of reference and biographical information to Bishop Vann, the Ecclesiastical Delegate for the Provision and was informed a few months later that I was invited to attend the Assessment review at Immaculate Conception seminary at Seton Hall (God bless our patroness!) University in New Jersey. Though I was a bit nervous going in, the seven faculty members, mainly priest/professors at SHU, put me at ease. They were there to discover what I knew and what I needed to learn over the next twelve months in the areas of Canon Law, Scripture, Church History, Spirituality, Moral Theology, Doctrinal Theology and Liturgical and Sacramental Theology. They were learned, kind and helpful.

Bishop Campbell has assigned Fr. Thomas Kessler, the pastor of St. Bernadette in Lancaster to be my Formation Mentor over the next year. At that time I may sit for an extensive written test covering my knowledge in these seven areas. I will also be asked to go back to Seton Hall for an in depth process of defending and explaining my answers. Part of my preparation includes taking two classes at the Josephinum. I share both of them with Brian O'Connor our seminarian!

One of the unexpected joys of the Assessment visit was to meet up with three other men, former Episcopal priests like myself, who are at the same stage of the process. We four, if we are ordained, will join nearly 150 other former Episcopal clergy who have become Catholic priests since Blessed John Paul II put forth this very gracious provision in July of 1980. I thank you for your past prayers and ask you to continue to lift me up in prayer in the future.
