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## Business Meeting Notes – March 13, 2013

The meeting was called to order promptly at 7:30 by Grand Knight George Schneider

**Roll Call of Officers:** All officers were in attendance with the exception of: Mark Borys - Financial Secretary, Mike Croyle - Recorder, Tim Bowie - Trustee - Excused; Phillip Beagle - Advocate - Absent

The minutes of the last meeting were motioned for approval by Wayne Patterson, seconded by Mike Sillings, voted on and passed.

**Chaplain's Report:** No Report

**Membership Committee Report:** Mike Sillings read Form 100's for Don Miller, Richard Schlachter, Deacon Joe Checca and Richard Krigbaum

A motion from Mike Sillings and second from Steve Malott, these men were voted upon and approved. A first Degree with them is scheduled for Wednesday, March 27th with Candidates Call at 6:30PM.

**Grand Knight's Report:** G.K. George Schneider then began with a list of important items.

Mission was special with Fr. Vinny and presented a great ministry and remarked that 3,000 kids showed up for his Ash Wednesday service.

St. Patrick's party is Saturday (March 16<sup>th</sup>) and help is needed starting at 4:00pm, dinner is at 6:00 followed by entertainment at 7:00, this is always a great family activity.

Talked about having to attend RCIA on Thursday followed by the Living Christ Retreat on Friday/Saturday

Blue Coat Dinner was changed to the 27<sup>th</sup> of April due to conflict with the Religious Education Dinner on the same evening.

We had over 50 men attend the Men's Conference, had we had an accurate count, a bus could have been scheduled, but caravanning also worked. Next year the Men's Conference is moving to a bigger building due to the growing number of attendees.

**Treasurer Report:** Brother Mike Phillips shared our bank account totals and we are financially sound.

**Financial Secretary Report:** Brother Bog Glavan filled in for Brother Mark Borys then reported on all bills and income for the month. These bills were motioned to be sent to the trustees for signing and payment. This was accomplished in a timely manner.

17 members are still in arrears for dues and a Knight Alert will be sent out.

Also commented that the fund raising has exceeded all expectations.

**Report of the Trustees:** Brother Wayne Patterson gave a summary of the pancake breakfasts that were held, we had a banner year.

**Chancellor's Report:** No Report.

### Report on Programs and Committees:

**Membership Director:** Rule 3 event was a success, we netted 4 to 7 new names, went over budget by a small amount. 40 people attended. 15 Knights and 12 Squires attended and the squires

netted 4 new names. George asked if anyone had an alternate idea to submit them, we are always looking for new ways of recruiting...

**Program Director:** No Report

**Church Director:** Brother Bog Glavan reported that he has fulfilled all criteria for the State programs. Religious of the Year is Deacon Hector Raymond, who was absent at this meeting. Pennies for Heaven is still going to be turned in.

**Community Director:** No Report.

**Council Director:** Brother Glenn Williams proposed Frank Hare (who was conspicuously absent from the meeting) as the Knight of the Year...he listed the accomplishments that Frank took care of during the year and was glad Frank could not turn it down since he missed the meeting.

Glenn also nominated Kyle Plank (via Mark Knight) as our "Youth of the Year"...Kyle is active in the Squires, SPY, church and school. He has been accepted to Notre Dame in the fall.

Glenn also thanked the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Knights that showed up to Jean Mulholand's viewing, thought only 4 showed and made it difficult to post, He knew that Jean appreciated the showing. Bog reminded the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree members of the Council that they should remember that you would want people to show up for you if you request the 3<sup>rd</sup> and/or 4<sup>th</sup> degree so you should do your part now.

**Family Director:** Brother Mike Phillips reported that the Easter Egg Hunt will be on Saturday March 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Youth Director:** Brother Jesse Garcia turned the floor over to the Scholarship chairman Gene Ebert for a report on the scholarship. To date only one application is on file and the deadline is closing in. Scholarship information and applications are on the web and are due in on April 1<sup>st</sup>. These are for children or grandchildren of any Council Knight.

**Squires Report:** Brother Mike Phillips reported on the latest retreat to Danville and that the participants had a great time. The Squires heard the medical report of the crucifixion of Jesus and attended the breakfast held by the Danville Council. The Circle is growing and is on the young side. We picked up four new members from the Rule 3 event.

**Right to Life Director:** Brother Glenn reported that Deacon Hector is asking for help for the 40 days for Life, they are in need of 11 knights to help cover the open hours, asked that Brother Jesse send out the information that was sent.

**Pancake Committee:** Wayne gave an update

**Fish Fry Committee:** We have had an excellent turnout for the events (429, 459 and 495, respectively) these numbers are a tribute to the outstanding job that Frank, Thom and Bob do.

**St Patrick's Day Party:** Brother Richard Petersen is running the gala event on March 16<sup>th</sup>! Come on out for a great time!

**Blue Coat Dinner:** Brother Ron Blymire will run this event on the 27<sup>th</sup> of April!

The purchase will come from a pro-life sign shop in Pickerington. Glenn Williams made the motion, Steve Malott seconded, discussion followed and the motion was voted on and passed.

**Cash Bonanza:** Brother Mike Sillings reported that each Knight received 4 tickets in their church mailboxes and the rest will be mailed to the other Knights. Please sell them or buy them yourselves the first turn in is due on April 1st

**Elections:** The trustees are working on the elections for Council Officer for the 2013/2014 fraternal year.

## Respect Life: Abortion in Pickerington

Good news! The Pregnancy Decisions Health Care board voted to open a PDHC office in Pickerington to offer women a pro-life alternative to abortion. PDHC offers free ultrasounds, referrals to pro-life doctors, and help to women in crisis pregnancy situations. PDHC type clinics have proven to be some of the best defenses against abortion.

**Now we need for EVERY Knight to take action!** In order to open a PDHC clinic in Pickerington, funds are needed, so there will be a fund-raising dinner for PDHC. There is no cost for the dinner, but donations will be solicited. There will be some great speakers and wonderful food (provided by Christy Rogers, wife of fellow Knight Bill Rogers). Past PDHC dinners have been informative, motivating events, so take your wife and friends to this important event and help us open a PDHC clinic in Pickerington.

All this started in January when an article in the Pickerington This Week local newspaper described a new medical clinic opening at 670 Hill Rd N in Pickerington. It described how this new facility used LED lighting and how environmentally friendly it would be. On the very next page was a big ad for a new office for Women's Complete Healthcare being opened in Pickerington by Drs. Mervyn and Milroy Samuel. These are the same doctors that operate the abortion mill on Cleveland Ave. where we often pray to end abortion. Guess the address of their new clinic? You got it: 670 Hill Rd. N, just two blocks from Seton, in the environmentally friendly building, but not so friendly to unborn babies.

The article and ad were the first anyone in Pickerington knew that these well known abortionists were planning on opening an office here. We immediately contacted the city council and found they were just as surprised and concerned as we were, but they also told us there was nothing they could legally do to prevent the facility from opening. It is zoned for light commercial, which includes medical offices, but not abortions. Drs. Samuel claim that abortions will not be done in Pickerington, but we know they will refer patients for abortions, will perform the required pre-abortion exam, and likely will prescribe RU-486, the chemical abortion drug. And all this is to occur within sight of Seton!

We believe the site was deliberately chosen because it is almost exactly between the two high schools in Pickerington, and high school students are among the prime targets of most abortion providers. Seton Parish and our Respect Life group immediately went into action and organized prayer vigils at the new clinic, hosted a meeting at Seton, and attended the next city council meeting. As word of all this got out, we got much support from other churches and people in Pickerington. The city council meeting had the largest attendance any of its members experienced and many people expressed their opposition to abortion doctors opening a clinic here. Dr. Samuel attempted to open his facility in spite of people praying outside during their scheduled open hours, but the city manager made them shut down until all construction documents and inspections were complete. As of this writing, they still cannot open and probably will not for

at least another month. We continue to pray outside the clinic every Monday and Tuesday from 2:45 to 5:00 pm (the clinic's listed operating hours) and Saturday from 10:00 to noon (to get the word out because Hill Rd is crowded then). **We need all the help we can get, so please join us there!** And thanks to all the Knights who have joined us in our prayer vigils so far!

There is good news in all this: many people from Pickerington and surrounding areas and churches have joined us in opposing this clinic. We need to fight abortion in Pickerington NOW.

## Council Officer Duties

Gentlemen, the time has come for our election of officer's for the next fraternal year. Many ask at this time, of the duties of the positions. These are listed here below for your consideration. Those not included here...Financial Secretary, Lecturer, and Chaplain...are due to the fact that they are appointed by either the Grand Knight or Supreme.

For any of you who wish to eventually attain the position of Grand Knight, a good practice (but, not a requirement) is to hold all offices. This aids you in directing your officers once in the top spot.

**Grand Knight:** The Grand Knight is responsible for the welfare of the council. He presides over council meetings, acts as an ex-officio member of all committees, appoints a membership and programming director, convenes officers for a monthly meeting, and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the state and Supreme Council. He should also be aware of the council's financial status and ensure that his signature appears on all checks drawn. The Grand Knight is a member of the Advisory Board with general supervision of the council's Columbian Squire circle.

**Deputy Grand Knight:** The Deputy Grand Knight is second in command. He assists the Grand Knight with council affairs and fulfills all duties assigned to him by the Grand Knight. Should the Grand Knight be absent from a council meeting, the Deputy Grand Knight presides. He is chairman of the council's retention committee and also a member of the Advisory Board charged with overseeing the council's sponsored Columbian Squires circle.

**Chancellor:** The Chancellor has a variety of responsibilities. Primarily, he assists the Grand Knight and the Deputy Grand Knight in the execution of their duties and oversees the council in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the members' interests in council activities. The Chancellor is chairman of the admission committee and a member of the Columbian Squires circle ceremonial team.

**Recorder:** The Recorder is similar to a court reporter or a secretary. He is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the council and its correspondence.

**Treasurer:** The Treasurer is responsible for the safekeeping and maintaining records of all council funds and accounts. He is responsible for depositing money into the council's accounts and provides a certificate of such monies to the Grand Knight. He is also responsible for payment of all expenses.

**Advocate:** The Advocate is the legal representative of the council and serves as the council's attorney at trials and investigations of any interest to the council. While he does not need to be a member of the legal profession, he should be familiar with the council by-laws, the Order's Charter, Constitution and Laws, Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting, and Robert's Rules of Order.

**Warden:** The Warden is the 'watchdog' for council property and degree paraphernalia, except the property of the financial secretary, treasurer and recorder. He is also responsible for setting up the council chambers for meetings and ceremonial work. During ceremonial exemplifications, he will appoint and supervise guards.

**Inside/Outside Guards:** The Guards have similar responsibilities, but distinct differences. The Outside Guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the inner door, the Inside Guard checks to make sure that their membership cards are current.

**Board of Trustees:** The Board of Trustees consists of three members elected by the council and the Grand Knight, who serves as chairman of the board. They oversee the work of the Financial Secretary and Treasurer, and with the Deputy Grand Knight serve on the council's retention committee. During council elections, only the Three-year Trustee is voted on, with the others moving on to become two and one-year trustees, respectively.
