Business Meeting Notes – February 27, 2013

The meeting called to order promptly at 7:30 by Grand Knight George Schneider.

Roll Call of Officers:

All officers were in attendance with the exception of:

Advocate - Philip Beagle, Warden - Ron Blymire, Recorder - Mike Croyle, 3rd year Trustee - Tim Bowie, 1st year Trustee - Jesus Garcia, Outside Guard - John McFaul, Lecturer Bud - Joos

The minutes of the last meeting were motioned for approval by Mike Sillings, seconded by Gene Ebert, voted on and approved.

Chaplain's Report: No Report

Grand Knight's Report: G.K. George Schneider then began with a list of important items.

This Saturday is Men's Conference. 12 Knights and 2 Squires will attend. Glen Williams reported no bus this year due to increased costs, will send an email out to have everyone meet at church at 6:30am for carpool. 40 attending from Seton (last year about 110 attended).

Confirmation Retreat (weekend of 2/17). Over 70 sophomores attended, GK thanked the many Knights who helped out.

Abortion Clinic: We are praying at the clinic (a couple doors up Hill Road from the church) Monday and Tuesdays from 2:45-5:00, and from 10-noon on Saturdays. GK asked all Knights to help show our support for the unborn and to show our strength as Catholics.

Pregnancy Decision Health Center is also planning an office a few doors up Hill Road from the church.)

"____ of the Year" nominations should be submitted to Frank Hare by March meeting.

St. Patrick's Party Planned for March 16th, Dick Petersen in charge.

Thank You cards were received from Pandora Porcase and Joie Petersen for the Wives' Appreciation Dinner.

Recruiting: Supreme is offering VIP double-points for Knights recommended from January to June.

We received two cards from Sacred Heart (thank you's for Mass Cards)

Membership/Admissions: Brother Sillings reported we have 4 interested recruits who will be attending tomorrow evening's recruiting event at Rule 3 - plus one transfer and Deacon Joe. Three members initiated in January. Brother Borys emphasized the need to collect dues and initiation fees prior to participating in First Degree.

The Rule 3 party will be from 6-9pm with 4 men and a transfer expected. There are also 4 Squire's prospects. Expected attendance about 40 people.

We have about 255 members with only 25% participation. Supreme will count any lost Knights that we get to re-enroll as new numbers for our quota.

We need 5 more insurance members to qualify for Star Council Award.

FS Brother Borys reported that the "Knight's Alert" will go out to about 40 delinquent members on March 1. Six weeks later he will send "Intent to Suspend" notice to those who have not responded.

Treasurer Report: Brother Mike Phillips shared our bank account totals and we are financially sound.

Financial Secretary Report: Brother Mark Borys then reported on all bills and income for the month. These bills were motioned to be sent to the trustee for signing and payment. This was accomplished in a timely manner.

Report of the Trustees: No report.

Chancellor's Report: No report. At this time GK Schneider presented the Bonanza tickets to Brother Sillings for distribution. First turn-in is weekend of April 12-13.

Report on Programs and Committees:

Program Director: No report

Church Director: Brother Bog Glavan brought up the commitment of the Council to a weekly hour of Eucharistic Adoration. He will check with the adoration directors to see if there might be some times available that would be more accommodating for our schedules.

Community Director: No report.

Council Director: Brother Glen Williams reported he has some "____ of the Year" recommendations he will pass to Brother Hare.

Family Director: Brother Mike Phillips reported the Easter Egg hunt details will be announced at March meeting. Brother Phillips is actively looking for a Family Director replacement since he has taken position of Chief Counselor with the Columbian Squires.

Youth Director: No report. Brother Gene Ebert stated he has only received one application for scholarships.

Squires: Brother Mike Phillips thanked the Council for great support during the recent Squire's Dodgeball Tournament. There were 92 attendees, 12 teams with 66 players in a double-elimination tournament. Brother Phillips thanked Frank Hare and family for the meals, Tim Bowie for the pizzas, and Jim Thesing for the brackets. The Squires will be presenting to recruits at tomorrow's recruitment party at Rule 3. They continue to sell sodas at fish fries. They plan to attend the State Volleyball Tournament and retreat in Danville the weekend of March 9-10. Brother Phillips would like to ask the council to fund additional shirts for the new Squires recruited by Tim Bowie - will bring up under New Business.

Right To Life: Brother Glen Williams reported that Right to Life Director Edd Chinnock would like to purchase yard signs from the budget which state "Save Our Babies - www.pick-life.org". Brother Williams moved to approve up to \$XXX dollars for the purchase of these signs. Seconded by Wayne Patterson. After discussion, motion was tabled until next business meeting.

Volunteers are needed for March 15th in the "40 Days of Life"

We will continue to pray in front of the abortion clinic on Mondays and Tuesdays from 2:45-5pm, and on Saturdays from 10-noon. Brother Laughery said he has attended city council and zoning commission meetings on the subject, which have had record attendances.

Standing Committees:

Pancake Breakfasts: No report. Brother Wayne Patterson asked the Treasurer to prepare a final report on the profits from the pancake breakfasts.

Fish Fry Committee: Brother Thom Laughery reported we broke the meals/sales record with our first fish fry of the year and then broke that new record the second week. Turnout has been fantastic, the help has been great. Take-out window has been a success, as has the processing of credit cards.

Blue Coat Dinner: No report

Wives' Appreciation Dinner: Brother Frank Hare reported there were 48 attendees, it was fantastic and the council needs to continue its support.

Free Throw: GK Schneider gave compliments to Joel Potts.

St. Patrick's Day Party: No report. GK Schneider will follow up with Dick Petersen.

Unfinished Business:

A pending motion to provide financial support to Knights attending Men's Conference was discussed. For clarity, Brother Bog Glavan moved we allocate up to XXX to pay a portion of the conference fee for any Knight who wishes to attend. Seconded by Frank Hare, voted on and approved.

New Business:

Brother Wayne Patterson moved we purchase a full-page advertisement in the program for the Fourth Degree Exemplification on the weekend April 5-6, recognizing Mike Phillips who will be attending. Seconded by Frank Hare, voted on and approved.

April 13 is the PSR Teachers Recognition Dinner with Chris Logsdon as entertainment. The Knights have been asked to assist. This date seems to conflict with the Blue Coat Dinner. GK Schneider will investigate.

May 4th is First Communion - Fourth Degree Knights are needed at 9:30 and 1:30 Masses.

May 6th is Confirmation with the Bishop - Fourth Degree Knights are needed, time TBD.

Frank Hare moved we purchase 6 gift cards to give to the "___ of the Year" award recipients. Seconded by Thom Laughery. Passed.

Thom Laughery mentioned we have two stoves which are in need of major repair/replacement. A committee will be formed to research costs and the possibility of sharing costs with the church.

Frank Hare brought up that next year is the 20th Anniversary of our Council and asked if we were planning anything special - Glen Williams is already organizing.

Mike Phillips asked for Council support for Squires' shirts. Mark Borys will check with our new shirt supplier on pricing and report next month.

Insurance Agent (Stan Krulia): Another member has signed up as an insurance member, only 4 more needed.
