

Business Meeting Notes - September 11, 2013

The meeting was promptly called to order at 7:30 by Grand Knight George Schneider.

Roll Call of Officers:

All officers were in attendance with the exception of our 2 Year Trustee, 3 Year Trustee and Lecturer.

The minutes of the last meeting were motioned for approval by Edd Chinnock, seconded by Mike Sillings, voted on and passed.

Chaplain's Report: No Report.

Membership Committee Report: This may sound like a previous request, but we still need somebody to step up and handle our Membership Program...an extremely vital part of our Council. Please consider this honor of assisting others to become members and brothers. We have candidates in the wings already (eight) and will attempt to have an installation before the October Business Meeting. We desperately need someone to shoulder the responsibility of acting as our Membership Chair. Please... someone accept this responsibility and help us grow. Councils without active recruitment slowly disband. Do not let this happen to one of the best councils in the state!

Grand Knight's Report: G.K. George Schneider then began with a list of important items.

Our Grand Knight expounded on the huge success of our Labor Day Parade and thanked all in attendance.

The Grand Knight then thanked all for their assistance at the Parish Festival, but hopes for more involvement next year,

Brother Schneider again encouraged us all to be involved with our Council's 20th Anniversary and hoped the mailing of invitations would go out soon and requested a swift response to them. We need a number in order to provide enough food. And in case you have forgotten ...this is a *free meal* for the Knights. It is a celebration of all of our hard work.

Sir George then reminded all of a predicted terrible winter coming according to the Farmer's Almanac, to which Brother Lowery was heard to respond..."Fine with me". Spoken just like a Southern Snow Bird...don't you think?

And finally...our G.K. asked for continued Membership Growth and asked all officers to seek at least ONE NEW MEMBER! The gauntlet has been laid.

Treasurer Report: Brother Mike Phillips shared our bank account totals and we are financially sound. He mentioned our CD is going to be rolled over on 10/13.

Financial Secretary Report: Brother Frank Hare read a large amount of bills and then informed us all that our Council is 247 members strong with 70 Insurance Members and 15 on the Inactive List.

The bills were motioned to be sent to the trustees for payment by Frank Piper, seconded by Mike Croyle, voted on and passed along for payment.

Report of the Trustees: No report. He was signing all the bills by himself.

Chancellor's Report: No Report.

Report on Programs and Committees:

Program Director: Brother Dick Petersen was ill, but sent in news that two reports were turned in and one was almost complete.

Membership: Brother Glavan then shared some ideas that he and Brother Lowery suggest our new Membership Director might follow to increase membership. The thoughts included:

- We should use a Sunday Mass to recruit.
- We could attend (even with some dressed in fourth degree regalia) all Seton Baptisms. We could provide a rose to the mother and a rosary to the father...and add a follow up call later to invite the father to join us.
- We could use a month (December was mentioned, I believe) to call new Church Members and solicit candidates.
- We could take advantage of our tremendous RCIA program and speak of our group and seek participation
- We could even tie in recruitment with our Wives Appreciation Dinner with invites to new candidates.

You see ... the steps are already in place. As a side...Miraculous Medal is celebrating their 20th Anniversary by inviting all Church Members to attend their celebration.

And just as another side...you can login to KofCColumbus.org and the State website to see what other councils are up to. See Mike for instructions.

Church Director: No report.

Community Director: Brother Laughery profusely thanked all for their involvement in the Pickerington Labor Day Parade. He believes our passing out of flyers greatly helped with attendance at the Parish Festival.

Brother Thom next reminded all of events coming up next...the Family Festival in October and the Coat Drive coming soon!! Please pick up a Coat form after the Masses on October 5th and 6th! We need your help to make this a success.

Council Director: Brother Williams updated us all on the plans for our 20th Year anniversary. It will be held October 19th following the 5:00 Mass. We will all sit together and Father Klima will bless us and our efforts at the end of Mass. Dinner will follow and will be a catered event by Christie Rogers and will recognize our charter members and past Grand Knights. A larger celebration will be held for our 25th anniversary. We discovered this event unfortunately conflicts with the Cranks Creek trip of which many of our members are involved. Sadly, it was the only time available on the church calendar for the event.

Brother Glavan then reminded all of the 4th Wednesday of the month morning breakfast club at Bob Evans on hill road. Breakfast begins at 9:15. Stop by if you are free!

Family Director: No report!

Youth Director: Brother Garcia announced that Religious Education is beginning and thanked two Knights for volunteering to teach. He noted that the youth would be involved in the Cranks Creek Shoe Drive! He spoke glowingly of the Youth activity at the Festival ... the highly successful and fun, Human Hamster Ball. Even Father Klima got in the act! No live hamsters were injured in the running of this event! Brother Jesse then mentioned planning of the Confirmation Retreat is already underway.

Right to Life Director: Brother Chinnock reported on the involvement of the Right to Life group in the Pickerington Labor Day Parade as well and how t-shirts were sold at the festival encouraging right to life.

He then mentioned the "Rally for Life" which will be held on Saturday, September 28th from 10:30 - 11:30 at 692 Hill Rd. A prayer service will be held and several speakers are scheduled for the event. Please attend if you can.

As bad news, a third doctor has been hired for the clinic on Hill Rd. As a matter of clarification, Edd mentioned that no abortions are actually performed at the clinic, but they can prescribe the pill and schedule patients for abortions elsewhere.

Squires Report: Brother Mike Phillips reported about the Squires success at the festival and the selling of their "Super Swigs". They sold 200 mugs and were happy with the money they made for the church!

Some Squires may attend a Leadership Retreat on October 21 and 22.

The Squires are also asking...or investigating...the possibility of running 50/50 raffles at our Pancake Breakfast and Fish Fries. A motion for this was conducted. Check New Business for the results.

Squires Shirts have been ordered.

Unfinished Business: Thom Laughery thanked all for their help with the Festival Food. Monies collected surpassed last year and John Letourneau was given props for all of the awesome Cinnamon Rolls he baked and donated on his own!

MOTION: The motion that up to \$XXX be spent for the 20th Anniversary Celebration of our Council was discussed, voted upon and passed.

MOTION: Thom Laughery motioned that we send a check of \$XXX to Council 5253 as a thank you for the use of their food trailer at the Seton Festival. The motion was seconded by Frank Hare, discussed, voted upon and passed!

MOTION: Stephen Malott motioned that we allow our Squires

to pursue with Father Klima and any legal entities necessary the opportunity to sell 5050 Raffle Tickets at our Knight's Pancake Breakfasts and Fish Fries. The motion was discussed, voted upon and passed

Gene Ebert then thanked the Council for their prayers, best wishes, company and assistance during his illness. He mentioned the visits even encouraged his involvement in a Men's Prayer group. We are glad to have you back with us on a regular basis Geno!

Remember...our Annual Coat Drive is kicking off! It is run by two of our wives...Joie Petersen and Rose Drignat. We need children's coats this year (which will be less expensive) in sizes 5- 16. The coats will be donated to the St. Vincent Family Center. Please stop by after the masses on the weekend of October 5th and 6th to pick up coat form or two. Thanks to the Knights who have already picked one up at the business meeting. Coats are due back in by Sunday, October 27th in Herrmann Hall. We need to purchase coats for 100 boys and 85 girls this year. Please...help out and get these kids in warm coats...as well as gloves and hats...for the winter! If you are shopping early, see Mike Croyle for forms he has left over from the meeting. And if anyone can be on hand following the Masses on October 5th and 6th to help distribute the forms, please contact Mike at 361-3183.

Deacon Hector then asked for volunteers to deliver a Love Seat and several small items to a family in Pickerington. Brother Don Miller graciously offered to complete this task.

Report of the Fourth Degree: Football Frenzy tickets are on sale for \$10 each. See Brother Mike Sillings for these tickets good for watching through ten weeks of the NFL Season. The tickets give you four different teams to watch each week. You add up the final scores of those teams. If your teams have one the top eight totals...you win money! Respect Life: October Respect Life Month

October is Respect Life Month. You may have noticed our Respect Life table in the gathering area; if not, please visit it and take some information home. You will find some very interesting reading there about various life issues. The table will be up the entire month of October. Here are some of the things going on this month:

We kicked off our activities a little early on September 28 with the Pick-Life Rally and Prayer service by abortion doctors Samuel facility. For those who may not know, Pick-Life is a pro-life group set up to unify the Pickerington community to protect and defend innocent human life from conception to natural death. We operate under the guidance of Columbus Right to Life and consist of representatives of many Pickerington churches. Check out our website at www.Pick-Life.com or on Facebook at facebook.com/PickLifePickerington.

Winfree Associates were kind enough to let us use their parking lot and grass so we had room to set up. Over 70 people showed up to celebrate life and pray for an end to abortion. Fr. Coleman from Our Lady of Miraculous Medal parish led the prayer service. Liz Christy from Seton and Jen Hissrich and Lisa Gresco from Our Lady sang beautifully while Jen Sweeny played keyboards. These four ladies have beautiful voices and make a joyful noise for the Lord! Guest speakers Beth Vanderkooi (director of Greater Columbus Right to Life), Mark Wolf (winner of GCRTL Defender of Life award), and Tim Welsh (executive director of PDHC) spoke about life issues in Pickerington and Fairfield County. The Rally ended with all of us enjoying donuts, coffee, and lemonade while we visited with each other.

What we heard from these speakers was that there is more than one abortion a week from Pickerington, about 55-60 per year from our zip code. There were about 100 per week in Greater Columbus in 2011, which is down from the previous year. The 2012 figures are due at the end of September, but are expected to continue to decline. Mark Wolf is a sidewalk councilor and usually goes to Founders clinic on E. Broad St. He said they experience about 10 "turn away's" a month. A turn away is when an abortion minded woman decides to leave the clinic without getting the abortion. Unfortunately, there are not enough

sidewalk councilors to cover all the hours the abortion mills in Columbus are open. If you are interested, GCRTL offers sidewalk councilor training - check their website for details. It was a great rally - you should have been there!

Please come join us in prayer at the sidewalk on Mondays and Tuesdays from 3 to 5pm and Saturdays from 10 to noon. We need to let Dr. Samuels know we do not want them in Pickerington!

Also in October is the 40 Days for Life campaign - from September 25th thru November 3rd. This year the campaign has chosen Founders Clinic at 1243 E. Broad St. for the prayer vigils. **The Seton Respect Life group agreed to cover from 7am to 7pm on October 30, so please select one hour to pray at the abortion mill. We will have sign-up sheets available after all the Masses on Oct 19-20.**
