He first thanked all of those 4th degree Knights who stood guard at the calling hours for Brother Bob McNicol. He next thanked all of those who sent Christmas Cards to our Seminarians which included gift card presents. He even read a thank you from one of the recipients. This vigil has been going on for one year now...and is hopefully affecting the clinic's

business. We need them to go away. Edd finally mentioned that Respect for Life Masses will be held the weekend of January 18th and 19th. A candle procession will be included. Each candle will represent MILLIONS of abortions and unjust deaths.

New Business:

This was seconded, discussed at length, voted upon and passed.

MOTION: Brother Mike Sillings then motioned that the Council reimburse any *wife of a council member* who pays the full amount to (and can provide receipts for) attendance to the *Catholic Women's Conference* with a return amount of \$20 for up to a \$400 limit of returns. This was seconded, discussed, voted upon and passed.

Paperwork acknowledging payment made to attend either conference should be turned in to Mike Sillings who will handle the bookkeeping of these events.

Brother Jesse Garcia then proposed the Council investigate the possibility of running a Car Show at Seton on the first Friday in June. The city of Pickerington has canceled their Car show for that time and it could be a good money maker for the council...with limited expenses incurred. We would provide food, a possible DJ, and trophies. At \$10 per entry...and space for 150 - 200 cars...the return could be great. It was agreed to run this by Father and get the wheels rolling. (Sorry...couldn't resist!)

Report of the Fourth Degree: Brother Frank Hare reported that plans for the Assembly 2900 evening out is moving along well as

Respect Life: March for Life Student Comments

A lot of snow and bitter cold temperatures made this March for Life bus trip and interesting experience. We left on Tuesday, January 21 in a snow storm and the snow lasted all the way to DC. 
