Culture of Life: Pope Francis' Words

Supporting Life From Conception Until Natural Death

This winter Vicki and I spent three weeks in Scottsdale, Arizona. While there we attended St. Bernadette church. On the Third Sunday of Lent, March 8th, their bulletin had the following article in the Culture of Life section. These comments from Pope Francis about the sanctity of life are worth pondering:

In a year that saw assisted suicide advocates be applauded by the press, Pope Francis made some poignant commentary about the sanctity of life in his message for the World Day of the Sick, reminding the world that life is always worth living, regardless of the perceived "quality" of it.

The Pope claims that it is a hypocritical lie that 'lurks behind certain phrases which so insist on the importance of "quality of life" that they make people think that lives affected by grave illness are not worth living!'. About this 'great lie', he says that 'even when illness, loneliness and inability make it hard for us to reach out to others, the experience of suffering can become a privileged means of transmitting grace'.

Pope Francis stated 'People immersed in the mystery of suffering and pain, when they accept these in faith, can themselves become living witnesses of a faith capable of embracing suffering, even without being able to understand its full meaning'. The Pope denounces that 'Occasionally our world forgets the special value of time spent at the bedside of the sick, since we are in such a rush; caught up as we are in a frenzy of doing, of producing, we forget about giving ourselves freely, taking care of others, being responsible for others. Behind this attitude there is often a lukewarm faith'. Therefore, the Pope urges us: 'I would like once again to stress "the absolute priority of going forth from ourselves toward our brothers and sisters" as one of the two great commandments which ground every moral norm'. Moreover, the Pope highlights 'how many Christians show, not by their words but by lives that are rooted in a genuine faith'. Living close to the sick, they are on a 'great path of sanctification' because if it is 'easy to help someone for a few days', it is instead 'difficult to look after a person for months or even years, in some cases when he or she is no longer capable of expressing gratitude'

Lecturer's Corner

Father Hawkins: 'A priest forever'

The following is excerpted from Father Patrick Sena, C.P.P.S., senior lecturer in Sacred Scripture. This is a partial reprint from that homily for Father Steve Hawkins.

"You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek." This verse was first stated by the Psalmist, and reemphasized by the author of the Epistle to the Hebrews.

And 1971, that was a good year, because in July of that year, because Steve went to the seminary in Cincinnati. He had become a seminarian in the theology school for the Diocese of Columbus. The author of the epistle to the Hebrews explained priesthood as compassion, fidelity, and service. In the 30 years that I knew him, he never complained once about the bishop.

He had a great love for his people. He understood that to be a priest was to be compassionate, to be understanding, to be faithful to God...whom he always said was good. "God is good"...and to serve.

The biggest day of the year for Steve, almost, was St. Patrick's Day...the big parade, the parties, and just enjoying being Irish.

The Epistle to the Hebrews reminds us and reminded Steve very well, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek."...a compassionate priest, a faithful priest, a priest of service. He always said, "God is good," and God is good. And now it is time to say, "Good-bye." It's an Old English word,... we use it all the time; we sort of mean "So long," whatever.

Yes, God is good. Steve, we say "Good-bye" "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek."


Kilian Bridget's Cystic Fibrosis Foundation bowling event at Rule 3 in Pickerington.
