## Culture of Life: - 40 Days for Life

*Supporting Life From Conception Until Natural Death*

By the time you read this, the fall 40 Days for Life campaign will have ended. From September 23 until November 1 people were praying at abortion mills in 307 cities around the world and 496 lives were saved. This is impressive, but what does this have to do with us here at Seton Parish and Council 11187 in Pickerington?

I am pleased to report that the Seton prayers had a direct impact! Seton's Respect Life group selected Tuesday, October 27, as our day to pray at Founders abortion mill on Broad St. in Columbus. A sidewalk counselor was able to talk to one woman going into the clinic and escorted her to the pro-life Women's Kinder Center pregnancy clinic a block up the street. Experience shows that once a woman sees an ultrasound of her unborn baby she almost always elects to have the baby. So add one more life saved to the total above!

But the news gets even better. Not long after the first woman went to Kinder Women's Center, a young woman with bright green hair showed up at Founders. She went in but came out shortly afterward. She told the people praying at the clinic that she didn't think this is where she wanted to be so they told her about the Kinder Center and one of the prayers escorted her up the block to Kinder Women's Center. Another life saved!

This is a very real and local example of the impact the 40 Days for Life movement has on abortion and saving lives. It shows that our prayers and presence do affect the abortion mills and the women going to them. Another example is a sign outside the Founders mill. It advertises their "Pledge a Protester" campaign, which apparently is designed to raise money to hire "escorts" to get the women into the clinic without allowing them to talk to the sidewalk counselors. It is interesting to note that while the sign has been there for several months, they haven't raised much money - the gauge on the sign is only about a third of the way up.

40 Days for Life started in Texas in 2007 with much help from the Knights of Columbus. It has grown from a local campaign in one Texas city to an international movement in 30 countries, 579 cities, 3588 local campaigns, and 650,000 volunteers. The results are impressive: an estimated 10,331 lives saved so far, 64 abortion centers closed, and 121 abortion workers quit as a direct result of the 40 Days efforts.

The original 40 Days for Life campaign was during Lent (hence the 40 days duration) and was so successful that it was soon expanded to include a fall campaign as well. It grew from that first city to what it is now and continues to grow. The next campaign will be during Lent of 2016 and Seton will again select a day to pray at either Founders or Planned Parenthood.

When we ask for volunteers to pray on that day, please prayerfully consider signing up for one hour. As shown above, **OUR PRAYERS DO MAKE A DIFFERENCE.**

FORMED truly is the Catholic faith - on demand.

Here's how easy it is to get FORMED: First, if you are not registered on our parish web site (<http://www.setonparish.com>) do so at your earliest convenience. Once registered you will notice the Formed.org oval at the bottom center of our homepage. Click that oval and the program will take you to a page containing a statement concerning "Safe Environment." Read the statement. If you agree, click the button and submit the form. The program will take you to a page with the parish code. Copy the code and then click on the picture. This will take you to the <http://www.formed.org> website. Click the Sign up button on the upper right and enter the parish code provided and follow the instructions on how to setup your own account. Now set up a username - whatever username you'll remember and a password. You can keep it simple now and change it later if you want. Now you are all set to use all the great programs on FORMED.org anytime by simply logging in. It is that easy! ## Saluting our Veterans

November 11, 2014 is Veterans day. What is Veterans day?

“**Veterans Day** is an American holiday honoring military veterans. Both a federal holiday and a state holiday in all states, it's always celebrated on November 11th each year. It is also celebrated as Armistice Day or Remembrance Day in other parts of the world, falling on November 11, the anniversary of the signing of the

Armistice that ended World War I. (Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 with the German signing of the Armistice.)”

In 1954 the Holiday was changed from Armistice Day to Veterans Day to honor American Veterans of all wars.

### The difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day

Memorial Day honors service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle. Deceased veterans are also remembered on Veterans Day but the day is set aside to thank and honor living veterans who served honorably in the military - in wartime or peacetime.

Also did you know that the holiday is commonly printed as *Veteran's Day* or *Veterans' Day* in calendars and advertisements. While these spellings are grammatically acceptable, the United States government has declared that the attributive (no apostrophe) rather than the possessive case is the official spelling.

We are privileged to have veterans as members of our council. The next time you see one of them, thank them for their service. Without them and the sacrifices they made, we would not live in the greatest country in the world.
