As always, my family and I will continue to pray for you and yours.



"Annuities Gain Popularity as Baby Boomers Age"

Six-plus years into a rising stock market, many Americans continue to crave financial certainty and shun risk, which helps to explain why annuity sales have held up so well. It's not just the stock-market backdrop that makes solid annuity sales interesting - it's also the low interest rates. More investors are buying annuities even though they're paying some of the slimmest yields in decades. "Normally, declining rates hold down sales of interest-sensitive products," noted LIMRA commenting on a 3 percent rise in annuity sales in 2014. Here are other factors that help explain the improved popularity of annuities, including conservative products: If you think interest rates will rise, it's smart to delay buying a fixed-rate annuity so that you can lock in a higher yield later. But after years of low interest rates, it's not a certainty that rates will budge by much anytime soon. Besides, the Fed's influence is focused on short-term rates such as those affecting money-market yields and credit card interest rates. Annuity yields are more likely to reflect intermediate-term interest rates, as these investments are backed by the bond portfolios held by insurance companies, noted Andrew Murdoch, a senior vice president of AnnuityFYI.

Culture of Life: - Planned Parenthood

Supporting Life From Conception Until Natural Death

By now you have probably heard about the controversy surrounding Planned Parenthood and its selling organs and tissue from aborted babies. As a result of several videos secretly obtained by The Center for Medical Progress, there are several bills being considered at the federal and state levels to defund PP. In these videos some high-ranking individuals in PP frankly discuss how they can make more money by selling organs and tissue from aborted infants.

It should come as no surprise that Planned Parenthood lies, evades, and participates in illegal activities. They have been dishonest from the very beginning. In 1916 Margaret Sanger founded the first birth control clinic in America in New York in violation of the federal Comstock act and a host of state laws, which prohibited the dissemination of sexual and contraceptive information. In 1921 her clinic became the American Birth Control League, an organization set up to evade existing laws prohibiting abortion and contraception.

Margaret Sanger was the child of Irish immigrants and was raised Catholic, but became an atheist after her marriage to William Sanger. She wrote books and articles promoting contraception which led to her fleeing America to Britain to avoid arrest on obscenity charges. When she felt it was safe, she returned to New York and continued to preach about contraception and abortion. Sanger believed in eugenics, which is the improving of the genetic quality of the human population by encouraging reproduction of people with desired traits and preventing reproduction of "undesirables". She believed in and participated in the forcible sterilization of Negro women as she believed blacks were an inferior race. Prior to World War II, she agreed with German Nazi and Hitler's racial purity programs and spoke favorably about the Third Reich. Margaret Sanger is a hero to Planned Parenthood and they even have awards named in her honor - is it any wonder they cannot be trusted?

The title "American Birth Control League" was found to be "too offensive and against families", so in 1942 it was changed to Planned Parenthood Federation of America.

You have to give their spin doctors credit - the new name sounds quite nice and gives the impression that they are for families and planning for the future. The reality is quite different - they do everything they can to prevent families and to destroy existing families. Planned Parenthood claims to provide reproductive health as well as maternal and child health services, but what they actually do is contrary to this claim. They provide contraception to prevent families and abortion to destroy them. As for the other "reproductive health services" like mammograms and Pap smears, PP does not actually offer them - only referrals to other health services. Yet somehow they have convinced our legislators that they provide valuable services to women and children and therefore should be subsidized by the government.

According to former Planned Parenthood clinic director Carol Everett, abortion and making money are their main focus and much of what they do is designed to foster this. In the film "Blood Money", she says that PP supplies birth control pills at the lowest possible dose so there is a higher failure rate. She also states that they get the cheapest condoms, which also have a high failure rate. This, of course, leads to more unintended pregnancies and therefore more abortions for the PP clinic and much more revenue. She claimed to make over a million dollars in just a few years by increasing abortions. She also says that when Planned Parenthood talks to students in schools, they tell them to not trust or confide in their parents about sexual matters, but to come to PP for advice.

Of course, PP is ready with contraception for them and encourages them to sexually experiment. Somehow this is supposed to "promote families".

Abby Johnson, a former PP clinic director who you may have heard speak at the Columbus Right to Life banquet last year, testified that her PP clinic got \$100 per fetal specimen for 500 specimens per day or \$120,000 per month. This is far in excess of what PP claims is "recouping costs". This selling of human tissue is illegal, but until now authorities chose not to pursue it.

The several videos released by The Center for Medical Progress have highlighted these abuses and Planned Parenthood's cold calculations of how much money they can make selling baby parts. They also describe how they keep the babies alive for 5 minutes or more while they harvest brains, hearts, livers and other organs. Even though the horrific practice of partial birth abortion is illegal in the US, the videos make it clear this is one of the ways they keep the babies alive until the organs can be harvested. It becomes quite clear early in the videos that making money is PP's primary focus.

There is something YOU can do - and it isn't difficult. Simply contact your US congressmen and senators and your state representatives and urge them to support bills to defund Planned Parenthood. A similar bill was recently defeated in the US Senate because the sponsors lacked the 60 votes needed for passage, but only a couple of additional votes are needed, SO CALL OR WRITE YOUR SENATORS NOW! And don't forget to PRAY, spread the word, and encourage others to write.

The Planned Parenthood abortion industry grew from the eugenic ideas of founder Margaret Sanger. She documented her ruthless beliefs in pamphlets, journals and books in the early 20th century. Such ideas include: "The most merciful thing that a large family does to one of its infant members is to kill it."

The eugenic ideas of the 20th century persist in today's abortion practice where it capitalizes on minority communities, disproportionately taking the lives of African American babies and babies with disabilities. In 2013, 42 percent of abortions took place on African American women--even though they make up 12.5 percent of Ohio's population.
