Field Agents Corner - Long-term care expensive for someone

January 22 is the 43rd anniversary of the 1973 Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion in the US. Abortion statistics: From Beth Vonderkoi, Director of Greater Columbus Right to Life:

"I would like to thank you all for joining us to pray for life. Since we started our first campaign, we have seen two of Columbus' four abortion clinics close or quit performing abortions. We have seen abortion numbers decline dramatically - there were nearly 2,500 fewer abortions in 2014 than in 2007, and we can estimate that nearly 10,000 unborn children have been saved from abortion (assuming figures had held steady at 2007 rates). We have no doubt that a large part of that dramatic decline is because of your prayers and your work in the community. We have also seen that since last fall's campaign at Founder's we have seen the clinic go from being open 5-6 days per week to being open 2-3 days per week. Most importantly, we've met the precious unborn children whose mothers turned away because of our efforts."
