

Business Meeting Notes - June 19, 2018

Prior to the meeting, Gene Ebert announced the Knights of Columbus scholarship winners. Abigail Chinnock, granddaughter of Edd Chinnock, received the \$500 Fred Barwick scholarship and Linda Clyburn announced that Trevor Bowie, son of Tim Bowie, received the \$500 Harry Clyburn scholarship.

Grand Knight Mike Kohar called the official meeting to order at 7:40 pm.

Roll Call of Officers: Missing were the Chaplain, Deputy Grand Knight and 2nd Year Trustee, all were excused. Wayne Patterson motioned to approve the minutes from last month's meeting, Mike Croyle 2nd. Voted upon and passed.

Chaplains Report: Absent, no report.

Membership and Reading of Applications: No applications.

Grand Knight's Report: GK Mike read a thank you card from Beth Vanderkoo, Director of the Columbus Right to Life, for our donation and support, last year there were 4,000 abortions in Columbus. Frank Hare and Thom Laughery attended the State Convention, we received one award, S.O.S. (Support for Seminarians). Only 7 councils out of the 383 councils in Ohio were recognized as Star Councils, our council was in the middle for total points. At the next meeting, "of the Year" Awards will be presented.
