Dear Brother Knights,

It's November and we start off the holiday season with two events. The first is Veterans Day, which I usually include in the newsletter, with a side piece explaining the difference between Veterans and Memorial Day. But, I get to use it as part of my article...

November 11, 2018 is Veterans Day. What is Veterans Day? “**Veterans Day** is an American holiday honoring military veterans. Both a federal holiday and a state holiday in all states, it is always celebrated on November 11th each year. It is also celebrated as Armistice Day or Remembrance Day in other parts of the world, falling on November 11, the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. (Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 with the German signing of the Armistice.)” In 1954 the Holiday was changed from Armistice Day to Veterans Day to honor American Veterans of all wars. The difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day? Memorial Day honors service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle. Deceased veterans are also remembered on Veterans Day, but the day is set aside to thank and honor living veterans who served honorably in the military - in wartime or peacetime.

We are privileged to have veterans as members of our council. The next time you see a veteran, thank them for their service. Without them and the sacrifices they made/make, we would not live in the greatest country in the world.

Our second holiday is Thanksgiving. Yes, the day of family, cooking, eating, football, and now shopping. But, I bet you did not know is a very Catholic and religious holiday. While it is attributed to the Puritan pilgrims in 1621, the first Thanksgiving was held on September 8, 1565 between the Native Americans and the Spaniards in St. Augustine, Florida with a feast and Holy Mass. Then, the truly "First Thanksgiving" celebration on American soil occurred on April 30, 1598 in Texas when Don Juan de Oñate declared a day of Thanksgiving to be commemorated by the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Fast forward a few years and the person credited with the “first” Thanksgiving, was Squanto, a Roman Catholic, that mediated between the Native Americans and the Puritan Pilgrims orchestrating what became known as Thanksgiving. But, the important part was that God was given thanks for all he provided to the people that came to this country.

And here is a piece of trivia for everyone; remember that "Thanksgiving" in Greek is *Eucharistia*. Thus, the Body and Blood of Christ is the true "Thanksgiving Meal".

As for our Council, we will be having our second Pancake Breakfast of the year on November 18. In addition, we are going to try something new for the Saturday night Mass crowd, a free soup dinner. Details are here in the newsletter. Brother Francis has taken the lead and will need your help in providing a pot of your best soup, stew or chili and of course, help with organizing, running and cleaning. Depending on how this goes, it will be added to the fund raiser weekends.

Finally, I want to end this with your continual prayers for our church, priest, Bishops, Cardinals and Pope Francis, to give us the strength to get through the turmoil facing our church and religion, and know that on the other side, we will be stronger!

God Bless our veterans; past, present and future, that God may look over them and thank them for their service.

Business Meeting Notes - October 10, 2018

GK Jesus Garcia called the official meeting to order at 7:35 pm.

Roll Call of Officers: Missing were the Chaplain and 2nd Year Trustee, both were excused. Wayne Patterson motioned to approve the minutes from last month's meeting, George Schneider 2nd. Voted upon and passed.

Chaplains Report: no report.

Membership and Reading of Applications: Shawn Roberts reported two transfers.

Grand Knight's Report: GK Jesus Garcia recently met with Father Jim who thanked us for everything the Knights do for the Parish. Father has some upcoming projects and may ask us to assist.

Treasurer Report: Dan Murphy sent out the financial report to the officers and program chairs, let him know if there are any questions. Paid for another year of liability insurance, has the new certificate.

Community Director: Dan M. Murphy reported he delivered to the St. Vincent de Paul Society a donation check from the Council, they were very appreciative.
