Grand Knight Report: GK Chuck Slaby thanked everyone for trusting him to lead/guide our Council the next 2 years. His focus is on parish, local community and then Fairfield County with assistance in Meals on Wheels and diaper programs. 

Lecturer's Reflection

Recently in the news and especially on social media, the Kansas City Chiefs' kicker, Harrison Butker, made quite a stir with his commencement speech he gave at Benedictine College (a Catholic college), located in Atchinson, Kansas. For those who either heard his speech or took the time to actually read the transcript, that person will note he spoke on a variety of Catholic related topics to the graduating class.

However, the news and social media took huge offense to a portion of his speech that mentioned women. I will read the full paragraph and preceding paragraph of the hugely offensive content, according to the news and social media:

"It is essential that we focus on our own state in life, whether that be as a layperson, a priest, or religious. Ladies and gentlemen of the class of 2024, you are sitting at the edge of the rest of your lives. Each of you has the potential to leave a legacy that transcends yourselves and this era of human existence. In the small ways, by living out your vocation, you will ensure that God's Church continues and the world is enlightened by your example.

*For the ladies present today, congratulations on an amazing accomplishment. You should be proud of all that you have achieved to this point in your young lives. I want to speak directly to you briefly because I think it is you, the women, who have had the most diabolical lies told to you. How many of you are sitting here now about to cross this stage and are thinking about all the promotions and titles you are going to get in your career? Some of you may go on to lead successful careers in the world, but I would venture to guess that the majority of you are most excited about your marriage and the children you will bring into this world."*¹

So there it is. Mr. Butker stated that the majority of ladies are more excited about eventual marriage and being a mother, than a secular career. In my opinion, the media greatly twisted Mr. Butker's words to make them come across that women are not good for anything except being a wife and mother, a baby making machine and servile spouse - this is grossly incorrect. Why do I bring this up? Because what I took away from this portion of his speech and the media outrage is the topic of identity.

Congratulations Fr. Leo!!

On July 7th, Council 11187 presented Fr. Leo Connolly with the "Clergy of the Year for the Columbus diocese." Past Grand Knight Francis Wilamosky and Current Grand Knight Charles Slaby made the presentation following the 11:15 Mass.



Many women think his speech meant that a woman's secular career is meaningless and that only being a wife is all that matters. Now in his speech he states that some of the ladies present may go on to successful careers in the world. He is not saying women can't be successful in secular careers, but a secular career is ultimately not fulfilling as the vocation of wife and mother - a secular career is not the sole criteria of identity. A secular career is not a vocation.

But what does this mean for us men? Quite frankly, the same thing. Typically for men, their job, their career, is their identity. Ask any man what he does, and he will tell you his job title. In fact, when we meet people for the first time, we ask them, "what do you do?" And the response to that question will form an opinion of their worth in our minds. But we must remember that our jobs are temporary - we are never our jobs forever. Because many men tie their identity to their job, when they retire or lose their job, feelings of aimlessness and usefulness creep in - life has no meaning now because their life has no meaning; this is what happens when we tie our identity to our job.

Being able to provide for our families is important, but we must not devalue our God-given vocation with a temporary secular one. Who are we then? We are adopted sons of God, through his son Jesus Christ. **This** is our identity. This can never be taken away from us. As a vocation, we are called to be husbands and fathers. Our identity cannot be taken away from us. The government cannot take this away from us, the secular world cannot take this away from us - try as they might. Therein lies the problem of defining our identity via secular careers or having our identity granted to us by the government - they can be taken away. Our identity is a holy and noble one. We must never take it for granted. The only one that can take our identity away from us is ourselves, and this happens when we sin mortally. So treat your vocation, your true identity as greater than any gold in the world. For you are greater than any job or any material object in existence. You are an adopted son of God."
