Chancellor's Corner - WORDS MATTER

As Knights, we have the Four Pillars: Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. As Knights, we are certainly known for all of the charitable activities we perform. However, it is my opinion that there is a charitable activity that is easily overlooked because we do not see those who benefit from it - and I refer to praying for those who have died.

The Church teaches that there are 7 corporal works of mercy and 7 spiritual works of mercy.

The 7 corporal works of mercy are:

- To feed the hungry;
- To give drink to the thirsty;
- To clothe the naked;
- To shelter the homeless;
- To visit the sick;
- To ransom the captive;
- To bury the dead.

The 7 spiritual works of mercy are:

- To instruct the ignorant;
- To counsel the doubtful;
- To admonish sinners;
- To bear wrongs patiently;
- To forgive offences willingly;
- To comfort the afflicted;
- To pray for the living and the dead.

While we are good at praying for the living, I think we forget that the dead still need our prayers. Part of the reason is that we don't see them anymore, so unfortunately, it's a case of "out of sight, out of mind."

Therefore, starting with this month's newsletter, I will be listing our Brother Knights who have fallen asleep in Our Lord for each month's newsletter. Subsequently, I ask all of you to pray either Psalm 130 (also known as *De Profundis*) or the *Eternal Rest* prayer. If possible, it is better to offer the

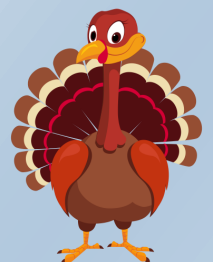
Lecturer's Reflection

This is a wonderful yearly event where the Knights are at their best!

Thanksgiving

Yes, the day of family, cooking, eating, football, and now shopping!

But, I bet you did not know is a very Catholic and religious holiday. While it is attributed to the Puritan pilgrims in 1621, the first Thanksgiving was held on September 8, 1565 between the Native Americans and the Spaniards in St. Augustine, Florida with a feast and Holy Mass. Then, the truly "First Thanksgiving" celebration on American soil occurred on April 30, 1598 in Texas when Don Juan de Oñate declared a day of Thanksgiving to be commemorated by the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Fast forward a few years and the person credited with the “first” Thanksgiving, was Squanto, a Roman Catholic, that mediated between the Native Americans and the Puritan Pilgrims orchestrating what became known as Thanksgiving. But, the important part was that God was given thanks for all he provided to the people that came to this country.

What is Veterans Day?

November 11, 2018 is Veterans Day. “**Veterans Day** is an American holiday honoring military veterans. Both a federal holiday and a state holiday in all states, it is always celebrated on November 11th each year. It is also celebrated as Armistice Day or Remembrance Day in other parts of the world, falling on November 11, the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. (Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 with the German signing of the Armistice.)”

In 1954 the Holiday was changed from Armistice Day to Veterans Day to honor American Veterans of all wars. The difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day? Memorial Day honors service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle. Deceased veterans are also remembered on Veterans Day, but the day is set aside to thank and honor living veterans who served honorably in the military - in wartime or peacetime.

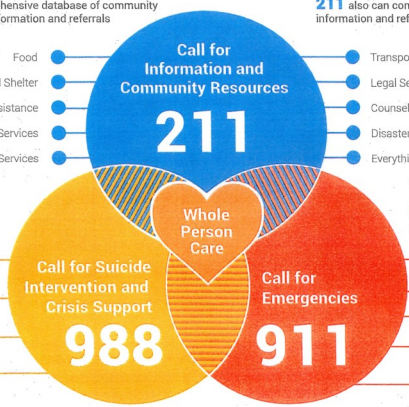
